
Victory for PRN - New Lenox Permit Appeal

This April, Prairie Rivers Network, along with Sierra Club, the Des Plaines Watershed Alliance and the Liveable Communities Alliance, won a major victory in the fight to protect Illinois waters from the harmful effects of new pollution. The Pollution Control Board (PCB) repealed a permit for the Village of New Lenox to expand its sewage treatment plant and dump more pollution into Hickory Creek, a tributary of the Des Plaines River, in Will County. The groups putting forward the permit appeal were represented by the Environmental Law and Policy Center.

Located in a rapidly developing Chicago "collar county," Hickory Creek is already subject to tremendous pressures from pollution from many sources. The creek supports an active smallmouth bass population, as well as a diverse assemblage of other fish, mussels, and aquatic insects. However, there are documented problems with excessive growth of algae in the creek, resulting in unnatural dissolved oxygen and pH conditions which threaten aquatic organisms. The likely cause of the algae problem is pollution from nutrients; the permit for the expansion would have allowed even more nutrient pollution.

In our appeal of the permit for the New Lenox sewage treatment plant expansion, we argued that in issuing the permit, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) did not consider the possible effects that more nutrients and algal growth, and therefore worsening oxygen

and pH conditions, would have on the creek. We also objected because IEPA did not follow USEPA guidelines in setting a limit for how much copper, a toxic pollutant in wastewater, would be allowed to be dumped.



The Pollution Control Board ruled in our favor on every count about the flawed analysis that served as the basis for the permit. The permit was repealed and the IEPA must now write a new permit, taking into consideration all the issues we raised. Basically, the Pollution Control Board held that before issuing permits, IEPA must take a hard look, backed by real science, at the potential environmental effects of new pollution and has to analyze whether allowing so much pollution is really necessary.

This major decision has set a higher bar for the level of analysis that IEPA must perform before allowing new pollution to be dumped in Illinois waters. The ruling will benefit Hickory Creek and will give Prairie Rivers Network an effective tool to push for greater protection of rivers, lakes, and streams throughout the state.

Permanent Protection of River Habitat along Middle Fork

This March saw the finalization of a \$2.25 million deal to transfer privately owned land along the Middle Fork of the Vermilion River to state ownership. PRN was instrumental in negotiations leading to the transfer of 1,135 acres of land from Dynegy, a private electric utility in Illinois, to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources.

In 2005, PRN, along with the Illinois Attorney General, the U.S. Department of Justice, USEPA, and several other

environmental groups, settled in a landmark air pollution lawsuit against Dynegy. The lawsuit filed in 1999, was part of a federal initiative to bring Dynegy's Baldwin Energy Complex and its other coal-fired power plants into full compliance with the New Source Review provisions of the federal Clean Air Act.

At the time, the Baldwin Power Station in Randolph County was owned by Illinois Power, and was one of the largest sources of air pollution in the nation. Dynegy acquired Illinois Power in 2000.

Under the settlement in this case, Dynegy will spend more than half a billion dollars over the next 10 years to control emissions from the Baldwin Station and four other power plants in Illinois including the Vermilion facility near Oakwood.

The settlement agreement also requires that Dynegy spend an additional \$15 million

on Supplemental Environmental Projects; the Middle Fork land transfer is part of this package.

The State's acquisition of this undeveloped acreage, situated along the east side of the Middle Fork of the Vermilion River completes a seventeen-mile corridor extending north from Kickapoo State Park along Illinois' only National Scenic River. The preservation of this habitat, which includes rare (in Illinois) sugar maple groves, will provide benefits for river and associated wildlife, and for generations of Illinoisans to come.

State Legislature Update

Great Lakes Compact Passes Legislature

The Great Lakes-St. Lawrence River Basin Water Resources Agreement ("the Compact") is one step away from becoming law in Illinois. The Compact legislation passed by unanimous vote in both the House (March 29th) and Senate (May 22nd). Once the bill is signed by Governor Blagojevich, Illinois will become the second of the eight Great Lakes States to adopt the Compact.

A coalition of state environmental groups, including PRN and the Illinois Environmental Council, designated Compact adoption as one of four top legislative priorities for 2007. To achieve this goal PRN worked to educate citizens, businesses and legislators on the protections and benefits the Compact will provide Illinois and its residents.

Unlike any other existing agreement or laws for Great Lakes protection, the Compact is the only agreement that focuses on long-term protection and management of Great Lakes waters to ensure a sustainable water supply, and that provides standards decision makers must follow in approving proposals for large volume water withdrawals.

Six million Illinois residents depend on the Great Lakes for drinking water. A diversity of Illinois commercial interests, recreational users, and numerous species of wildlife also depend on Great Lakes waters and water-related habitats. In adopting the Compact, Illinois is taking a leadership role in protecting the quality and sustainability of one of the world's most unique freshwater ecosystems.

Pending Bills

In addition to the Compact, Illinois legislators are considering several other bills this session that could positively or negatively impact our state's water resources. Listed by their status as of June 13th these include:

Passed Both Houses: SB376 – Starting January 1, 2010, prohibits the sale, manufacturing, or distribution of any cleaning agents containing more then 0.5% phosphorous by weight; SB1241 – Thermostats containing mercury are prohibited from 1: installation in new construction (July 1, 2008), 2: any sale or installation (July 1, 2010) 3: disposal in landfill or incineration (July 1, 2008).

Still Active: HB3728 – Provides that installation of a "surface discharging private sewage disposal system" that enters the waters of the State requires a coverage letter under a NPDES permit issued by the Illinois EPA.

Failed Bills/Action Deadline Passed

SB54 – Provides Illinois EPA may collect and solicit citizen complaints for violations of the Environmental Protection Act, but prohibits anonymous complaints alleging violations resulting from agricultural production and certain dairy production facilities; SB569 – Reduces annual fees under NPDES permit for mines producing coal from \$5,000 to \$1,000.
