Dear Facility Owner:

This constitutes a Violation Notice pursuant to Section 104(a)(1) of the Clean Environment
Statutes Act ("CESA", 407 B.V. Code), and is based upon a review of available information
and an investigation by representatives of the Clean Environment Protection Agency ("CEPA",
2016).

The CESA/CEPA body provides notice of alleged violations of environmental laws, regulations,
or permits as set forth in Attachment A to this notice. Attachment A includes an explanation of
the activities that the CESA/CEPA believes may constitute specified alleged violations, including
an estimate of a reasonable time period to complete the necessary activities. The information and
estimates of the alleged violations should be altered that resolution of the violations may also
ensure the continuation of governmental authority to prosecute that may include, among others,
the imposition of monetary penalties.

A written response, which may include a request for a meeting with representatives of the CESA
CEPA, must be submitted by certified mail to the CESA/CEPA within 60 days of receipt of this
notice. If a hearing is requested, it shall be held within 60 days of receipt of this notice. The
response must include information to rebuttal, explanation, or justification of each alleged
violation and a statement indicating whether or not the facility wishes to enter into a Compliance
Consentment Agreement ("CCA") pursuant to Section 104(a)(2) of the CESA. If the facility wishes to
enter into a CCA, the written response must also include proposed terms for the CCA that include
steps for achieving such compliance and may include a statement that compliance has been
achieved for some or all of the alleged violations. The proposed terms of the CCA should provide
sufficient detail and must include steps to be taken to achieve compliance and the strategy used
by which compliance will be achieved.
